



Professor C.J. Dominic (M.Sc, Ph.D. Banaras, Ph.D. Cantab., FNA, FNASc)

Born on 1st June 1930 in Kattor, Alleppey, Kerala, Prof. Candanat John Dominic obtained his first Ph.D. degree from Banaras Hindu University in 1959 for his thesis on Avian Endocrinology. Later, he earned his second Ph.D. degree in 1965 from the University of Cambridge for his pioneering work on mammalian reproductive pheromones with late Prof. Sir A.S. Parkes, FRS. Prof. Dominic was inducted to the faculty of Zoology Department, Banaras Hindu University in 1958, and continued till his superannuation in May 1995. His research contributions in the areas of mammalian reproductive pheromones, mammalian reproduction and fertility control, avian reproduction, hypothalamo-hypophysial system and bursa of Fabricius in birds have been recognized both nationally and internationally. He has published over 250 research papers and contributed several reviews/chapters in books and supervised 18 research students.

Prof. Dominic is a recipient of Gulbenkian fellowship from the University of Cambridge (1962–65) and Biomedical fellowship of the Population Council, New York. He was elected as a Fellow of the Zoological Society, Calcutta in 1975, the Indian National Science Academy, New Delhi in 1984, the National Academy of Sciences, Allahabad in 1987 and as a Foreign member of the Erlangen Physio-Medical Society, Germany in 1989. He has been associated with several national and international Scientific Societies, and served in the editorial boards of several national and international journals. Besides, he served in various expert committees constituted by the UGC, ICAR, ICMR, UPSC etc., Government of India.
